


Week beginning 6th May 2024

unique names for the colours they had created and once again, it was so lovely to see such collaboration amongst our youngest and oldest pupils in the school.


A huge congratulations to Sebastian from Kwilkyn who got from Kwilkyn who got man of the match today in his team, St Stephen Under 's, foot-





HOUSEHOLD SUPPORT FUND

We have been asked by Cornwall Council to share the information below with you in regard to the Household Support Fund

The entitlement criteria for automatic payments from the Household Support Fund is changing.

In order to be entitled to a payment from the Household Support Fund scheme in 2024, you must be responsible for at least one child and on 3rd June 2024 either:

- be entitled to Council Tax Support or
- have been placed in emergency accommodation by the CouncilYou will receive £80 per child. If you are already in receipt of Council Tax Support, then you don't have to do anything else you will receive your payment automatically.

Why have we made this change?

Because entitlement to Free school meals has been protected since 2018, parents of children who are entitled to free school meals aren't always still on a low income. By using our Council Tax Support data, we can ensure that the Household Support Fund awards are going to parents who currently have a low income and are struggling with the increased costs of running their home. By better targeting the awards, we are able to help families with children of any age, rather than just school age children.

Families of children in receipt of free school meals can still access help through the Time2Move holiday programme. This scheme offers fun physical activities, games and wider activities plus a meal for all children during the main school holiday periods.


Parents/carers or professionals can access the parenting offer by visiting www.cornwall.gov.uk/parenting.

Guidance on infection prevention and control in schools and childcare settings#

Updated: November 2022

Remember you can help prevent the spread of infections by checking children have had their routine immunisations, maintaining a clean environment, and ensuring good personal hygiene (among staff and children), especially ensuring regular hand washing.

Chickenpox and shingles	Five days from orset of rash and until all lesions have crusted over	Advise pregnant women to contact their GP If exposed and unsure if they have previously been infected.
Cold Sores (Herpes Simplex)	None	Cold sores remain contagious until they are completely healed. They are generally mild and heal without treatment (7-10 days) - Avoid kissing and close skin to skin contact of the sore - Don't share items that come into contact with the affected areas (cutiery / lip balm)
Hand, Foot and Mouth	None	Contact your UKHSA HPT If many children are affected. Exclusion may be considered in some circumstances
Impetigo	Until lesions are crusted over or 48 hours after antibiotic treatment has been started	impetigo is highly infectious, and it is spread by direct contact Artiblotic treatment speeds healing and reduces the infectious period
Measles"	Excluded as soon as measles is suspected until five days after the onset of rash	Contact UKHSA HPT as soon as measies cases are notified to the school.
