We'll be wishing lots of luck to our Netball Team who will also be representing the school on Monday next week at the Roseland Academy!






Chickenpox and shingles	Five days from onset of rash and until all lesions have crusted over	Advise pregnant women to contact their GP If exposed and unsure If they have previously been infected	
Cold Sores (Herpes Simplex)	Nona	Cold sores remain contagious until they are completely healed.
