Dear Parents/Carers,

This year Cornwall Music Service Trust is delighted to be able to offer; guitar and ukulele lessons at Grampound with Creed School. The lessons take place in school afternoons and are centred on the student's interests. In lessons students discover their preferred styles and aspirations whilst learning how to play a musical instrument in different genres and styles in a friendly and nurturing setting.


Numerous studies have shown that learning a musical instrument is a powerful tool in improving student's performances in all subjects. Learning music gives a child a sense of achievement and allows them to express their creativity whilst improving listening, motor and memory skills.

Guitars and Ukuleles can be purchased or hired from the Cornwall Music Education Hub. A piano is provided for lessons in school but will need to be hired or purchased for home. There are lessons of different group sizes and length available through Cornwall Music Trust, with subsidies available to students; in care, on free school meals, in receipt of DLA or parents serving in the armed forces.

Guidance on infection prevention and control in schools and childcare settings#

Updated: November 2022

Remember you can help prevent the spread of infections by checking children have had their routine immunisations, maintaining a clean environment, and ensuring good personal hygiene (among staff and children), especially ensuring regular hand washing.
