My thanks must go out to the teachers and staff for doing their utmost to keep all the children safe and delivering lessons in school to our Vulnerable and Critical Keyworker children. We will be operating a rota system to ensure that we have a minimal number of staff in the building and to give teachers time to focus on remote learning at the same time.

The Government expectation is that all KS1 children will spend a minimum of 3 hours daily and KS2 children will spend 4 hours daily, completing home learning tasks and other activities, so please do keep us informed of any illness during this lockdown period if your child is unable to complete their work.
