Message from Ms Jarrett

Dear parents and carers,

It's hard to believe that it is already October, we have been so busy at school that the time has flown. The classes have been continuing with their History based topics and have been keen to share their learning via our Zoom celebrations on Mondays. The children continue to impress us all with their thoughtful conversations and high level enquiry skills and all staff are very proud of their achievements.

Our Reception children have also been carrying out the Reception Baseline Assessment activities. The purpose of this is to create a starting point to measure the progress schools make with their pupils from reception onwards and is statutory for all schools to complete. This has been a relaxed and non-pressured process for our children and we have been very proud of how well they have engaged with all the activities.

You will have received a letter via email yesterday regarding the increased levels of Covid 19 in Cornwall, especially in schools. Unfortunately, my Y7 daughter contracted Covid 19 at her school and has passed it on to me. I am very thankful that I only spent one day at GwC on Monday this week and most of this was on my own in my office. I didn't spend any time with children in classes and kept a safe distance from staff throughout the day. All staff have carried out testing since that day and are all negative.

This does highlight the need for continued caution, however, and I am sure you will all continue to keep a safe distance when around the school for drop off and pick up. I will keep you informed of the situation but hope to be back in school on Monday October 11th all being well.





Grampound PFA - Bags2School

As part of our fundraising this term Grampound with Creed PFA have joined the Bags2School scheme. For those who have not hear of the scheme they collect good quality second hand clothes and bedding and we get sum of money depending upon how much is donated. Unlike previous year they ask that clothing donations are given in a good quality black bin bag. If the bag splits and the clothes get wet or dirty then they will not be able to accept them. The collection date will be 25th November in the morning so you have plenty of time for a clear out. Below is a flyer with the details of what donations are accepted.

WHAT WE COLLECT

We accept the following 'good quality' items for RE-USE*:

- Men's, Ladies' and Children's clothing
- Paired shoes (tied together or elastic band around)
- Handbags
- Hats
- Bags
- Scarves and ties
- Jewellery
- Lingerie
- Socks
- Belts
- Soft toys
- Household linen
- Household curtains
- Household towels
 - Household bedding (bed sheets, pillow cases and duvet covers)





We **DO NOT** accept:

- Duvets and blankets
- Pillows and cushions
- Carpets, rugs and mats (including bath, shower and toilet mats)
- Soiled, painted, ripped or wet clothing
- School uniforms with and without logo
- Corporate clothing and workwear
- Textile off cuts, yarns or threaded material

In the event of inclement weather please protect your Bag2School investment by covering with a plastic sheet or storing bags undercover as wet items cannot be accepted.
