



If we have more than one candidate, we will ask you to take part in an election for the position.

As a school, we have a joint local governing body with Grampound Road. Governors play a role in both supporting and challenging the school as it shapes education for our local community. We look to recruit people with a variety of skills to bring a diverse range of opinions to decision making.

As a governor, you would have an enquiring mind, the confidence to ask questions and debate issues that affect the school.

Rainbow MAT is a creative and imaginative organisation that has a mixture of large and small schools across Cornwall.

What do school governors do?

Governors tend to meet at least termly throughout the year. These meetings are usually conducted in person.

In order to perform this role well, a governor is expected to:

- Get to know the school, including visiting the school occasionally during school hours, and gain a good
 understanding of the school's strengths and <u>weaknesses</u>;
- Challenge and ask questions of senior leaders to ensure progress towards school goals;
- Support senior leaders to ensure the school runs as effectively as possible:
- Attend induction and relevant training when necessary
- Attend meetings (four times per year for approximately 1 2 hours);
- Act in the best interest of the pupils and staff of the <u>school</u>;
