






Dear Parents/Carers,

Next year Cornwall Music Service Trust is delighted to be expanding the number of musical instruments which your child could learn at your school. As well as the current offering of Brass instruments, from September students will also have the opportunity to learn the Guitar, ukulele and recorder. The lessons take place in school afternoons and are centred on the student's interests. In lessons students discover their preferred styles and aspirations whilst learning how to play a musical instrument in different genres and styles in a friendly and nurturing setting.

Numerous studies have shown that learning a musical instrument is a powerful tool in improving student's performances in all subjects. Learning music gives a child a sense of achievement and allows them to express their creativity whilst improving listening, motor and memory skills.

Instruments can be purchased or hired from the Cornwall Music Education Hub. There are lessons of different group sizes and length available through Cornwall Music Trust, with subsidies available to students; in care, on free school meals, in receipt of DLA or parents serving in the armed forces.



### Guidance on infection prevention and control in schools and childcare settings<sup>#</sup>

Remember you can help prevent the spread of infections by checking children have had their routine immunisations, maintaining a clean erwironment, and ensuring good personal hygiene (among staff and children), especially ensuring regular hand washing.

Rashes and skin infections	Recommended period to be kept away from school or childcare setting	Comments	
Chickenpox and shingles	Five days from onset of rash and until all lesions have crusted over	Advise pregnant women to contact their GP If exposed and unsure If they have previously been infected	
Cold Sores (Herpes Simplex)	Nona	Cold sores remain contagious until they are completely healed. They are generally mild and heal without treatment (7-10 days) - Avoid kissing and close skin to skin contact of the sore - Don't share kerns that come into contact with the affected areas (cutlery / Ip balm)	
Hand, Foot and Mouth	None	Contact your UKHSA HPT If many children are affected. Exclusion maybe considered in some circumstances	
Impetigo	Until lesions are crusted over or 48 hours after antibiotic treatment has been started	Impetigo is highly infectious, and it is spread by direct contact. Antibiotic treatment speeds healing and reduces the infectious period	
Measles"	Excluded as soon as measles is suspected until five days after the onset of rash	Contact UKHSA HPT as soon as measles cases are notified to the school. Preventable by immunisation (MMR x2doses). Promote MMR for all pupits and staff Advise staff contacts who are pregnant, unimmunised or have weakened immune systems to contact their GP immediately.	
Molluscum contagiosum	None	A self-limiting condition. The lesions will resolve over time without any treatment
