




Get ready for an extraordinary literary adventure...







What do school governors do?

Governors tend to meet at least termly throughout the year. These meetings are usually conducted in person.

In order to perform this role well, a governor is expected to:

 Get to know the school, including visiting the school occasionally during school hours, and gain a good understanding of the school's strengths and <u>weaknesses</u>;

- Challenge and ask questions of senior leaders to ensure progress towards school goals;
- Support senior leaders to ensure the school runs as effectively as possible;
- Attend induction and relevant training when necessary
- Attend meetings (four times per year for approximately 1 2 hours);
- Act in the best interest of the pupils and staff of the <u>school</u>;


