Meet Chipper, the adorable pup here to entertain and inspire your kids through lockdown.

Chipper Club was originally created between the wars to entertain kids and more 165,000 Children across the country earned a Chipper badge. The Chipper Club was so popular that it even enrolled one of the Queen's dogs, also called Chipper, onto its books in 1981.

We've now reinvented Chipper for a new generation of homeschooled kids and we're inviting Parents across the country to sign their kids up to the club and get involved in Chipper's Challenges. Each week the Chipper Club will set a brilliant new project for kids that they can do without leaving the house. The projects will incorporate Chipper's traditional themes of friendship, helping and obeying their parents, imparting a cheerful spirit and being kind to animals. Each roject will be designed with input from primary school teachers but will also be lots of fun to do.

Once each project is done, we'll ask parents to submit a photo of their child's work to the Chipper Club for publication online and in our local newspaper titles across Reach Plc. At the end of the lockdown period, we'll send all Chipper Club members a certificate to take back to school with a special gold certificate for children who have completed all the challenges.
