



You should have received a letter this week to confirm consent and collection information for your children. We would appreciate any remaining forms being returned as soon as possible to update our records.





Dear Parent/Carer

You may be aware from media coverage that the NEU (a Teaching Union) have declared strike action, which will take place on 1st February, 2nd March, 15th March & 16th March 2023. The strike is happening because of a national dispute between the unions and the government over teachers' pay. Whilst it is always our last option we giving you as much notice as possible that learning could be disrupted on the above dates. We will of course consider several options, including opening for some classes or year groups wherever it is safe to do so. We may also be able to open to a limited number of vulnerable students and some of the children of key workers but until we know how many staff will be in, we cannot guarantee this. We recommend that you start to make alternative childcare arrangements for these dates.

I am sorry about the potential disruption to you and to your child's education. I understand that this situation may be frustrating, but we will be working closely with our staff union representatives to keep up to date with the situation, and I will inform you of the final arrangements as soon as possible.

Hand-washing technique with soap and water



Wet hands with water



Apply enough soap to cover all hand surfaces



Rub hands palm to palm



Rub back of each hand with palm of other hand with fingers interlaced



Rub palm to palm with fingers interlaced



Rub with back of fingers to opposing palms with fingers interlocked



Rub each thumb clasped in opposite hand using a rotational movement




Rub tips of fingers in opposite palm in a circular motion



Rub each wrist with opposite hand



Rinse hands with water



Use elbow to turn off tap



Dry thoroughly with a single-use towel



Hand washing should take 15–30 seconds





Guidance on infection prevention and control in schools and childcare settings#

Updated: November 2022

Remember you can help prevent the spread of infections by checking children have had their routine immunisations, maintaining a clean environment, and ensuring good personal hygiene (among staff and children), especially ensuring regular hand washing.

Rashes and skin infections	Recommended period to be kept away from school or childcare setting	Comments	
Chickenpox and shingles	Five days from orset of rash and until all lesions have crusted over	Advise pregnant women to contact their GP if exposed and unsure if they have previously been infected.	
Cold Sores (Herpes Simplex)	None	Cold sores remain contagious until they are completely healed. They are generally mild and heal without treatment (7-10 days) - Avoid kissing and close skin to skin contact of the sore - Don't share kerns that come into contact with the affected areas (cutiery / lip balm)
